

# OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE GENERAL BANDING PERMIT

## Introduction

The Ornithological Society of New Zealand Inc (OSNZ) holds a General Permit (48320-FAU) which authorises members to carry out projects involving catching and banding birds where these projects have been approved by the Birds New Zealand Scientific Committee. The authorisation began on 1/3/2016 and expires on 28/2/2026.

**Note:** The legal name of the Society (The Ornithological Society of New Zealand Inc; OSNZ) is used in documents concerning the catching and banding birds under General Permit (48320-FAU) because this legal document was issued to OSNZ, not to Birds New Zealand.

## **Administration of Projects**

### Applications to operate under the Permit

Applications may be submitted at any time via the Birds New Zealand Banding Liaison Officer. Four documents are provided to applicants:

- Application for a banding project under the OSNZ general permit
- Banding Project Leader Acknowledgement Form
- A copy of the General Permit
- A copy of further requirements listed by the Department of Conservation.

#### **Assessment of applications**

The Banding Liaison Officer forwards details of applications to the Chair of the Birds New Zealand Scientific Committee and to the DOC Banding Officer for their comments and/or approval.

The Banding Liaison Officer replies to applicants either with a written letter of approval or with details of why a project was not considered suitable. Suggestions for a revised application may be made.

#### **Monitoring of projects**

Each year, after the date at which banders are required to submit their banding records to the DOC Banding Office, they are requested to complete and return a report on their activities under the General Permit.

A form is provided for guidance: Annual Reporting Form for Banding Projects Operating under the General Permit

#### **OSNZ Report to DOC**

Once the project monitoring forms have been returned, the OSNZ Banding Liaison Officer compiles a report for the Department of Conservation.

#### Banding Liaison Officer's Report to Birds New Zealand Council

The OSNZ Banding Liaison Officer shall provide an annual report to the Birds New Zealand Council before each Annual General Meeting.
