OSNZ National Wader Census June - July 2015 November - December 2015 & January - February 2016 Summary compiled by Adrian Riegen

Winter Census 2015

A total of 118,337 waders of 19 species were counted during the June - July 2015 wader census, (Table 1), down from 122,822 in June - July 2014. There was good national coverage with only the two key sites of Parengarenga and Raglan not counted. Parengarenga was only partially counted in 2014 as well. Numbers of red knot were up on 2014 but bartailed godwit numbers were down as were South Island pied oystercatchers. Wrybill's were very similar 4,108 verses 4,112.

Rarities included, 1 marsh sandpiper and 1 sanderling.

Summer Census 2015

A total of 137,020 waders of 25 species were counted in the November - December 2015 wader census, up from 131,350 in 2014. National coverage was again very good, with the only key sites of Parengarenga and Rangaunu not counted. The big difference was the red knot number, up by over 4,000 on 2014. The bar-tailed godwit count was similar to the 2014 number but still well down on previous years. Turnstone numbers were just below the thousand again at 992. Parengarenga was a stronghold for turnstone, so the lack of count from there will have influenced the count.

No real rarities during this census but uncommon waders included, 1 great knot, 1 pectoral sandpiper, 1 grey-tailed tattler, 1 lesser sand plover and 2 grey plover.
