



Reef Heron - 1 Te Haumi 30 Sept, 1 Tauranga Bay & 1 Mahinepua, 11 Oct

Cattle Egret - Flock of 103 on the Camp Road paddock at Waiharara on 13 Sept (KM).

Royal Spoonbill - 20 Pupuke middle of last year; 120 Unahi Road 22 Sept, 260 Te

Variable Oystercatcher - Many records and counts during Dotterel census. Evidence of breeding in many places including Otehei Bay, Urupukapuka Is, beach west of Waipiro Bay, Kowhai Beach, 5 pairs all with chicks on Motumaire Is (Paihia). Over 40 on Kokota Sandspit 13 Nov. Pied Oystercatchers in much lower numbers over the period.

Pied Stilt - 95 in paddocks in Pupuke Road 6 Feb 2011; 50+ Paua 13 Nov.

New Zealand Dotterel – see census results on page 5.

Banded Dotterel 6 in wader flock at Kowhai Beach, 20 Nov (AG), also

recorded from Spirits Bay, Great Exhibition Bay; 8 at Bluff / Te Paki area of 90 mile beach, 10 Sept

Wrybill - 1 Waimamaku Beach, 9 Oct (CD); 12 on Kokota Sandspit 13 Nov (IDG).

Pacific Golden Plover - 1 Kokota Sandspit 13 Nov (DD); 2 on Kowhai Beach 20 Nov. (AG).

Turnstone - c.200 on Kokota Sandspit on 13 Nov (DCD); 13 Kowhai Beach on 20 Nov (AG), 2 Rangihua Bay, Purerua, 3 Nov (Tim Robinson).

**Knot** About 230 in flock, Kowhai Beach, 22 Nov (AG), c.200 Kokota Sandspit 13 Nov (CD).

**Sharp-tailed Sandpiper** – at least 1 on Kokota Sandspit, 13 Nov (CD).

Whimbrel - 25 on Kokota Sandspit on 13 Nov - (DCD).

Bar-tailed Godwit - 850 in wader flock just past southern creek on Kowhai Beach – approachable to about 40 metres. Red flag on left leg of one and orange band on right leg of another, 20 Nov (AG). 4 Waitangi Estuary & 2 Te Haumi 30 Sept (CD), 10 Waitangi Est on 10 Oct. 4,000 estimated on Kokota Sandspit on 13 Nov (CD).

**Brown Quail** – Recorded from Matauri Bay & Moturoa Island.

Banded Rail - one close to Colin & June's house Whakaangi / Hihi on 22 July.

Caspian Tern - Reported from many sites especially during NZD census in preparation for its own census in due course.

White-fronted Tern – Reported from many coastal sites, 74 south of Te Paki 10 Sept.

Kaka – heard flying over Puketi Forest during NZ Robin census on 16 July (AG), 2 regularly visiting garden in Kerikeri Road from early August (Theresa Vucich).

Shining Cuckoo - 2 seen and heard on Otaio west side (Moturua Is), 23 Oct, one 28 Oct (LMA).

Noisy party for 2 hours by 4 to 5 birds on 23 Nov in Kohumaru Rd (AG), 1 being fed by a Grey Warbler on Moturoa Island on 17 Dec.

**New Zealand Pipit** – Seen in dunes in many places during NZD census.

Fernbird – heard on Urupukapuka Island 7 Nov (CD).

**Whitehead** – Birds introduced to Moturoa Is are spreading (see article on page 7).

**Tomtit** 2 pairs seen near high dam, 23 Oct, 2 calling in Wai-iti Bay, Moturua Is, 5 Dec (LMA).

**North Island Robin** 1, possibly 2 calling in Awa-awa-roa Cove, Moturua, 5 Dec (LMA), 3 on Moturoa Island 17 Dec (field trip).

## **NEW ZEALAND DOTTEREL CENSUS**

Many thanks to everyone who assisted with this census. The large bundle of completed sheets of results have been sent to the co-ordinator, John Dowding. A summary of the results is set out below. They show a small increase since the last census in 2004 but we feel that with increase in protection measures in some places they should have fared better overall. Clearly there are many places where there are no such measures (especially along the west coast) and the birds continue to decline because of predation and disturbance. We still intend to get a count for Walker Island.

### **MOTUROA ISLAND NEWS**

#### **WHITEHEADS**

The August 2011 issue of Apteryx reported the successful translocation of Whiteheads to the island in May. The birds have spread quite widely on the island and there are plenty of unbanded juveniles around. A few of us recently checked the area around Days Point, the closest mainland to the island but none there yet – just a matter of time though, surely . . .

### **GANNETS** Paul Asquith reported in October:

I am delighted to be able to report another success over the recent long weekend, in addition to the All Blacks win of the Rugby World Cup – at least one and possibly two 'live' gannets have taken up residence and were seen by several people at the Alcatraz site. Let's hope they stay around and it is the start of some action!!

The solar powered acoustic call broadcast was working beautifully when this picture was taken on 22<sup>nd</sup> October. Herewith the picture, can you spot the new arrival?? . . . . It's the odd one out!!!

#### MONITORING IN DECEMBER

In spite of the short notice and proximity to Christmas, members and guests arrived on Moturoa on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> Dec for bird-monitoring, weekend's hosted by CJ and Carol Ralph. the activities Among were scrambling up steep checking burrows for Grey-faced Petrels, Little Penguins, Kiwis or whatever else might lurk in there and we succeeded in finding 4 downy but well-grown Petrel chicks. We searched the forested areas on the eastern half of the island for Robins and although 3 were heard or seen, the birds



were clearly in lower numbers than was hoped. A few Tomtits were in the same area of forest.

We watched a Shining Cuckoo being fed by a Grey Warbler which looked half the size. A couple of places yielded small flocks of Whiteheads and we were pleased with the spread of this species.

Those who stayed overnight enjoyed some loud sounds of Kiwi, 3 of which were later roaming around near the Ralphs' house. The following morning we managed to climb the vertical cliff at the side of the promontary of Alcatraz with the help of ropes and visited the Gannet-enticing site at the far end. Amid the decoys was one real bird, perhaps the same one as in Paul's photo.

In the afternoon we toured the Black Rocks by boat and counted Red-billed & Black-backed Gulls, White-fronted and Caspian Terns breeding on these islets.

### Collins Travellers Guide to the Birds of New Zealand. By Julian Fitter and Don Merton


