Queen's birthday weekend is a good time for a short break away. I'd recommend attending the OSNZ Scientific day/AGM/Conference. This year five local members took the trek to Tauranga. The host region supplied great organization, the talks and presentations were illuminating, the workshops inspiring, the food was plentiful, and to cap it all off, the Monday field trips. These outings are a wonderful organized opportunity to see great birding spots around the country, this time, Mayor Is, Maketu estuaries, Athenree Wetland and Rotorua Lakes. Thank you OSNZ Bay of Plenty. I always enjoy the camaraderie of fellow birders, the chance to catch up with birders from around the country and hear what they have on their patch, the chance to hear the latest research, and the chance to catch up with old friends and make new ones. I've started planning for Queen's Birthday weekend in Dunedin next year already.

OSNZ SCIENTIFIC DAY

Many of this year's presentations, not surprisingly, had a 'Rena' inspired theme. Talks covered different aspects, including the logistics of organising the oiled wildlife response, the impact on seabirds, management of the NZ dotterels, causes of seabird mortality, the actual process of cleaning up oiled birds and even a sociology talk on the impact on volunteers. Aside from the actual physical effects on oil covered birds, a question was raised on the effects of ingested hydrocarbons. The clean-up of this disaster was a collaborative effort of different organisations, Massey Oiled Wildlife Response Team, DOC, BOP Council, and the co-operation of local people and volunteers, and funded by Maritime NZ.

Other topics included morepork studies in Hamilton, SBBG studies on Rangitoto Is, shag studies, a talk presented by our own Alec Milne from Golden Bay on distribution of SI Kokako – Grey Ghost, and research into moult, hydrophobicity of feathers and the uropygial gland of hihi and kiwi.
