

## **Whio Forever**

Through the bush telegraph I heard that a **blue duck** has been seen recently in the Brook Waimarama Sanctuary. Great news for Nelson city. Further afield, The Department of Conservation put out a media release on 28 July, "Aerial pest control and 'nest egg' programme boost whio population" and within the article mentions: 'Since 2003, 60 WHIONE(Whio Operation Nest Egg)-reared juveniles have been released into the Wangapeka-Fyfe Whio Security Site. The goal is to establish 50 pairs in the site which currently has around 30 pairs.'
