"There's the usual good amount of spring activity over here in the Bay......the **tui** are getting bolshy, there are **kereru** all over the place, I've counted 6 of them in one tree at a couple of different locations. Plus there were 5 **cattle egret** in a tight little group, standing in with the cows in a dairy paddock to the right of the main road just before the Takaka River bridge going north. I see them regularly here in the Bay at this time of the year, but not as many as 5 in one group before. We also have at least a pair still here from the group of **mute swans** which spend the winter here on the farm at Motupipi. Apparently the **godwits** are starting to appear here in Golden Bay; I ran into a friend in town this morning and she said they are coming in – some good numbers back already."

From Mac Harwood:

"Recently saw 14 **white faced herons** feeding 100m from our home. Never seen so many in a flock" (Cobb Valley Road).

To have **Australian wood ducks** confirmed as a new breeding bird for NZ, especially in our region. In January two adults and two juveniles were recorded on private property in the Tasman area but not confirmed as breeding there and recently on several occasions different combinations of one female and three male adults have been reported in the same vicinity.

But do we need this?

Again from Ken George: -23 Sept "darndest thing - I stopped in at the Lake Killarney here in Takaka late last week; I have a look in regularly to see if the resident dabchick is still there (it is) and got a bit of a surprise. After a cold start to the day, the sun had come out and there, sunning itself right out of the water on a half-submerged log in the middle of the lake, was a dinner plate size tortoise!!"
