Minutes of meeting on 21 January 2006 confirmed.

Accounts for Payment:

General Business

1. Murray provided a summary of the AGM, Scientific Days and Conference. The main points of interest to members being

Change of name for OSNZ:

The results of the referendum regarding a change of "brand name" to BIRDS NZ have indicated that 226 votes were received from members. 207 votes in support of a name change and 19 votes against. There was considerable discussion at the AGM. Executive members suggesting that the referendum was not a complete survey as Corporate and Overseas membership were not canvassed. The executive will treat the subject with some urgency with the "name change issue" being resolved at or before the next AGM.

• Site maps/Guides

Although many local regions have publications where birds can be found there was discussion

regarding the publication of a laminated pamphlet for each region. Each map to provide birding sites which are accessible to the public without crossing private land. The maps to include directions of travel and likely species at the site. Brent Stephenson is co-ordinating the North island draft pamphlets.

National, Regional and local "back yard" Surveys.

With the completion of the five year Atlassing Scheme many members were suggesting a method of national bird census (similar to Garden Birdwatch in the UK or Great Backyard Bird Count in the U.S. and Canada; or Backyard Bird Survey in Australia) in which all members could participate. Schools could be encouraged to carry out surveys of the school grounds or near by parks at regular intervals during the year as a way of developing an interest in ornithology and gaining new membership.

The scientific committee considered the suggestion impractical with a problem finding a suitable person to co-ordinate and report on the project. There was a follow up presentation on the Scientific day by Eric Spurr of Landcare Research who discussed a website programme being developed accessible to anyone who wished to enter/obtain information on bird species at any site in NZ. For more information go to Eric Spurr's email address is spurre@landcareresearch.co.nz He will provide further information to interested persons.

National Projects

The discussion at the R.R's meeting re the above surveys continued to include the analysis of date submitted regarding Moult Studies; Beach Patrol Reports, Breeding Records and Waderbanding projects.

Again the problem was finding a person suitable to co-ordinate and write up the project reports. It was agreed the projects were important and should continue.

Membership Leaflets.

A new OSNZ leaflet has been designed and printed. This includes a members application form. Samples were handed to Regional Reps. Another print run is being made and Hawkes Bay Region will receive 750 copies which will be left at places accessible by interested members of the public eg. DOC Office, Information Centre, libraries etc. The meeting authorised the printing of stick on labels with my contact details for members interested in joining OSNZ.

· Census results.

Attached are the winter census results for Ahuriri, East Clive and Porangahau. The census at Porangahau had to be delayed a month due to the weather conditions. Some good birds were seen. A Falcon on the Lagoon Farm; 1 Bittern at the top of the Estuary; 172 Black-fronted Dotterels (well up on previous years); 54 Royal Spoonbill; A hybrid Black Stilt and 67 Wrybill at Porangahau. Thank you to all those who helped out.

Other Interesting sightings.

16 Cattle Egrets seen by Christine in July on S.H. 50 near the Napier/Hastings turnoffs Two **White Herons** and the **Little Egret** are still in the Muddy Creek, East Clive area. **White Heron; Little Egret; Bittern and 2 Mute Swans** seen by Wayne and Margaret about the 29th July at Muddy Creet, East Clive.

A **White Heron** fishing for gold fish on a property at Richmond Road, Maraenui – 2 August – reported to and seen by Murray.

2 **Spotted Shags** on the Napier Wharf – adjacent to the Fishing Club boat ramp – Seen by Murray on 8/8/06. Both birds developing breeding plumage.
