Census and Wader Banding checks have been carried out during 2006 during February, June, October and November. No NZ ringed/flagged migratory waders have been seen in the Hawkes Bay. The results of the census and wader counts are attached. I thank all members who assisted.

Bernie Kelly of Clive is our latest new member. Welcome Bernie to the Hawkes Bay Group and we look forward to your attendance at future field trips.

Recent sightings of note.

New Zealand Dotterel - 5 birds (possibly 3 breeding pairs) seen at Porangahau during November One female had leg rings – was banded as a fledgling on Portland Island in January 2002.

Shore Plover – Porangahau Beach on 17 November 2006. Leg rings Blue over white on right leg – Green over orange on left leg. This bird was reared at Mt Bruce and released on Portland Island in 2002.

Large Sand Dotterel – Porangahau Beach on 17 Nov. 2006. (It was near a NZ Dotterel and the comparison assisted with identification.

Bar- tailed Godwit – with leg rings - orange over yellow on right leg, metal band on left leg (This bird was captured and banded in South Australia).

Reef Heron – 17 November 2006. A pair seen together on rock platform between Blackhead and Pourere Beaches

Whimbrel - 1 at Porangahau on 17/11/06; 6 at Mahia 30/12/06.

NZ Falcon – 1 has been present over summer at the Hastings Golf Course. A breeding pair observed at Boundary Stream in early January 07.

Grey-tailed Tatler – 1 seen with a group of Bar-tailed godwits on Pourere Beach on 17/11/06. 1 has been seen at different times at Ahuriri Estuary.

Godwits & Golden Plover – At time of writing the birds present at Ahuriri Estuary are starting to colour up.

Royal Spoonbill - 54 birds counted on the Napier Airport pond on 15/02/07

Chestnut-breasted Shelduck – A pair were present on the Southern Marsh in early January.

N.Z. Record- During the 2006 year, Brent Stephenson has seen 206 species of New Zealand birds. Its been interesting following your ramblings around N.Z. Well done from all in Hawkes Bay.
