What's on at Birds NZ Canterbury: August - October 2022

Field Trips

August 20 - A visit to Okuti Valley Reserve to do some bird counts. We will also stop to look for Australasian Crested Grebes at Lake Forsyth and Sulphur-crested Cockatoo at Ataahua Valley.

September 3 - A beach patrol south of Birdlings Flat. Meet there at 9:30 am. Good footwear and clothing required.

September 17 - A trip to Washpen Falls. This is a 2-3 hour round loop track on a working high country farm with waterfalls and plenty of birds. Moderate fitness is required. Since it is a private property there will be a cost of \$10 per person. Please contact Don by September 10 if you would like to attend.

October 1 - A beach patrol, meeting at the car park at the sea end of Spencer Park at 9:30 am.

October field trip - The Canterbury Underwater clubrooms in Kaikoura have been booked for October 13-18 (5 nights, 6 days). People will take independent transport to Kaikoura, parking I'm told is pretty good. Members can stay for one night, the whole time, or choose your preference. The preferences of those first in will be accomodated as well as possible. The cost is \$35 per night for adults and \$5 for children. Pillows, undersheet and mattress are supplied, but take your own bedding and kitchen linen. Note that there is a \$5 one-off fee per person

for the club cleaners to wash the sheets and pillowcases. There may be some sharing in dorms. Please contact Janet for specific bedroom numbers in each room. There is plenty to see, with lots of good walks, and an Albatross Encounter pelagic trip can be booked if enough people are interested. RR's Update

Lots of bird counts have been undertaken over the last few months including the garden bird count - well done everybody! Sightings have been made of Marsh Crake at Styx Mill, Halls Creek, and Travis Wetlands. A Northern Shoveler has been seen at the Ashley and is still at Pegasus. A Sharp-tailed Sandpiper was photographed at Travis Wetlands, as well as a Chestnut Teal. There have been reports of Barn Owl at Rakaia and an Intermediate Egret at Lake Ellesmere. Australasian Crested Grebe are doing well at Lake Forsyth. The wader count at Lake Ellesmere and the Ashburton Lakes count didn't reveal anything out of the ordinary. Results of the Lake Ellesmere count can be seen at the end of the Wrybill. Australasian Gannets have been reported off Taylors Mistake.

The Birds NZ AGM and Conference held over the Queen's Birthday weekend was a success in every way possible. Thanks to Jim Briskie for organizing a diverse and interesting range of speakers. Right from the first talk to the last was excellent and enjoyed by everyone who attended, with lots of positive feedback. Thanks to Nick Allen for a superb effort in organizing the conference. He did a sterling job with help from Sandra, Jan and the other organizing committee members.

Our meetings have gone well with Terry Thompson giving a talk on his book The Lonely Islands - The Evolutionary Phenomenon that is New Zealand. Nick Allen has shown us some British birds and Sarah Wilson gave us a talk on her work with Predator Free Banks Peninsula.

Health and Safety

For everyone to have an enjoyable time on field trips and other activities we need make sure everyone stays safe. Here's how you can do your bit.

1. Wear clothing appropriate for the activity such as plenty of warm layers, hat and gloves in winter; sunhat and sunglasses in summer. Bringing a raincoat is always a sensible option. Footwear needs to be suitable as well – think sturdy soles and good ankle support for many

walks, especially on hills, something that can get wet and muddy especially at Lake Ellesmere in winter. Walking poles could be helpful to some on steep and/or uneven ground.

- 2. Be honest and open about your physical abilities. Not all trips will be suitable for everyone. If you have a preexisting medical condition that could impact the trip (such as but not limited to asthma, allergy to bee stings, diabetes) please notify the trip leader of the condition, any problems that could arise and what the trip leader and others may be required to do to assist you. This information will be kept confidential unless a medical event requires it being shared. Make sure you bring whatever medications you may need.
- 3. Bring enough food and drink for the event plus a little extra in case the trip takes longer than planned. Fresh water is not always available and dehydration can be a concern in summer so bring your own drinking water.
- 4. Listen to the health and safety briefing given at the beginning of each trip. Keep your eye out for any unexpected hazards and talk to the trip leader and others if you have any concerns along the way. Let the trip leader know of any accidents or near misses.
- 5. Stay with the group at all times unless you have the trip leader's okay.
- 6. The trip leader reserves the right to decline participation in any trip if they have concerns about anyone being unable to participate safely or not being suitably equipped.
- 7. Health and safety incidents or concerns must be reported to the trip leader/RR immediately.
