

## **SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE**

## **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

- 1. To ensure the scientific rigour of studies undertaken by the Society.
- 2. To generally oversee Birds New Zealand studies of birds and their habitats.
- 3. To provide advice to Council for achieving appropriate and effective dissemination of information about New Zealand birds and their habitats.
- To provide scientific input to funding applications to assess the scientific content of proposals and the ability of applicants to achieve the outputs. Make funding recommendations.
- 5. Review and audit scientific reports sent to Birds NZ (mainly reports funded by Birds NZ).
- 6. To provide critical assessment and overview of the Society's schemes and projects to ensure that they have clearly defined purposes and contribute effectively to knowledge of New Zealand birds.
- 7. To provide leadership in identifying what priority projects the Society should consider initiating.
- 8. To maintain effective contact and appropriate collaboration with the Scientific or Research Committees of similar societies in the South Pacific Region.
- 9. Generally to do all such things as are considered by the Committee or Council to be conducive to the attainment of any or all of the foregoing terms of reference.

## Recommendations for committee membership:

- Members are appointed by Council to try and balance age, gender, regional spread and scientific expertise.
- Each member ideally completes up to two terms of 3 years, with an opportunity for Council to review each position after 3 years.
- The role of Chair should be limited to a 3 year term only.
