August Meeting Recap

Members were treated to an interesting evening on banding which in NZ is mainly done to measure bird longevity and internal migration. Mist netting and canon netting are the 2 methods used and Andrew explained the need to extract birds from mist nets in the same direction they entered. Banders need to remain calm at all times to prevent bird injury as parrots are particularly susceptible to brain haemorrhages when netted. Captured birds are weighed, aged and banded before being released. You can apply to band birds as a level 1 bander but must be under supervision by a level 3 bander of which there are very few, For more on banding information to to
