

OFFICERS, 1954-55.—Members will have received the notification required by the society's constitution calling for nominations for the positions of president, treasurer and secretary. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.—In accordance with the council's recent decision, this year's general meeting will be held in Auckland on the evening of Friday, May 21, 1954. Full details of place and time and also of the field excursions will be notified later. It had been hoped to hold the meeting in Dunedin, but the gathering of scientists in Auckland from May 17 to 21 for the Science Congress of the Royal Society of New Zealand made the latter city a more convenient choice.
