Ornithological Snippets

The long-staying Mute Swan|Wāna on Lake Waihola was resighted on 19 November. Chukar were seen at The Remarkables on 31 October and onCoronet Peak Road on 13 November. Marsh Crake|Kotoreke were reported from Butterfields Wetland, Lake Hawea on 25 October, at Shotover Wetlandon 26 and 27 October, 13 November, and at Moke Lake on 11 November

Australasian Little Grebe|Tokitokipio were at Glenorchy Lagoon on 18 th October and Diamond Lake on 25 th October.

Little Black Shag|Kawau tūī continue to be seen, with birds at Kakanui 8 November, and two near Portobello on 19 November. An inland Pied Shag|Kāruhiruhi was at Lake Dunstan 25 October, with another at Diamond Lake on 25 October. Reef Heron|Matuku moana was seen at Taiaroa Headon 3 November, and Nugget Point on 13, while the WhiteHeron| Kōtuku was at Glenorchy on 3 November, with two there on 9 November.

Finally Kaka|Kākā were still near Balclutha on 30 October, at Pounawea on 13 November, and two were at Awakiki, near Balclutha, on 18 November.

The 2025 eBird Taxonomy Update is now complete. If you are subscribed to ebird notifications, you should have received an invitation to download a Personalised eBird Taxonomy Update Report.

Changes relevant to New Zealand include the splitting of Whimbrel into Eurasian and Hudsonian, and Eastern and Western Rockhopper Penguin are now classed as separate species.

For those of you who use Merlin to make audio recordings, there has been a slight change in that recording are now not automatically saved, and you have to save them manually after each recording, and before closing the app. Just click the "Save" tab in the upper right hand corner.

Notes from the RR & Inland Birding

Conference 2026 - The Conference Registration Form is nearly complete and will be available on-line soon.

Thanks to the fantastic team work of the Conference Committee for getting us to this point.

The Matuku Muster effort was increased in Otago this year with the continuing efforts of Franny and Catriona in the Catlins and the support of Wai Wanaka volunteers in Wanaka who sent four people out into the dusk, the Whakatipu Wildlife Trust who coordinated 13 volunteers and the Routeburn Dart Wildlife Trust who had 8 people out listening. No bittern were heard in the Whakatipu, but two question marks were laid over unconfirmed detections at the Glendhu Wetland and The Neck. I ran an in-person and on-line training session to support this effort and local birders reported enjoying the evening listening. Wendy Ambury (Love Bittern) paid a visit to some of these community groups while she was passing through sharing her inspiring love of bittern. If members find their way to those areas, you're encouraged to have a listen. It's also worth a listen at the Butterfield Wetland check for Spotless and Marsh Crake.

As this year draws to a close, I hope you can all reflect on a year well lived and that you have some good birding to look forward to over the summer.

Braided River birds have had variable river conditions to contend with, as is usual for spring; the Lower Shotover colonies of black-fronted tern, black-billed gulls and banded dotterel appear to be settled into the breeding season now though.
